Veteran's Summary

Point In Time Surveys were submitted for 14 homeless veterans, which accounted for 2% of the total number of surveys received. Because of the format of the Survey Form, detailed information is difficult to assess for individuals other than the Head of Household. The following results are based on the responses for the heads of household and do not include additional family members.
