

Point InTime Survey  
January 2012  
Summary

Charles County agencies submitted 659 Point In Time Surveys. Because of the format of the Survey Form, detailed information is difficult to assess for individuals other than the Head of Household. The following results are based on the responses for the heads of household and do not include additional family members.
